Pasqua First Nation TLE Settlement approved by ratification vote in 2008. Total shortfall acres required: 6,686.55 Acres purchased to date total 8,569.6 Lease Revenue from lands purchased are payable to Pasqua TLE Holdings Inc. Lease Revenue pays land taxes and/or land improvements. Bank Balance ending December 31st each year is payable to RBC Revenue Account. Annual Lease Revenue: \$230,000.00



TLE Settlement Agreement: RBC Capital Account \$8,823,272.85 Funds used to purchase 6,686.55 shortfall acres of lands. Equity acres: 32,504.59 Total acres eligible for purchase: 39,191.14

TLE Revenue Account – RBC Receives annual interest from Capital Account TLE Operating Account: PHT Receives operational budgeted funds from Rev Account for board and lands acquisition costs.

TLE Holdings Inc.: PHT Receives lease payments for those lands purchased pursuant to the Trust. Balance at Dec 31st each year is payable to RBC Revenue Acct



On June 17, 2014, Pasqua filed Statement of Claim against Canada & Saskatchewan for failing to fulfill the terms of the Pasqua TLE Agreement.

Reserve Land Update:



Reserve Lands currently being leased

- Reserve Lands currently being leased pursuant to Sec. 28(2) of the Indian Act.
- Approximately 3,700 acres subjected to Sec.
 28(2) permits
- Generating approximately: \$105,500.00/annually
- Lease Revenue is made payable to: Her Majesty the Queen in Trust/Pasqua First Nation.
- Lease Revenue is administered by Indian and Northern Affairs Canada.

Reserve Land Update:



Reserve Lands currently being leased
Funds are withdrawn by Band Council Resolution (BCR) prior to Christmas each year.
Distribution is made to all Pasqua First Nation Member.
Funds are used to have Pasqua Christmas Dinner

in Regina and Pasqua First Nation.



Flood Claim Settlement Money:

Ratified on September 11, 2013 Amount: \$20,622,278.00 Settlement Monies received: March 19, 2014 Deposited into Pasqua Legacy Trust Per Capita Distribution (PCD) ✤50yrs and Older: \$5,000.00 ✤18-49 yrs: \$2,000.00 Minors: \$1,500.00 ✤Held in trust till 18 years of age. Trust gains 4% annual interest.



Flood Claim Settlement Money:

 PFN obtain \$3,600,000.00 loan to distribute PCD as per Legacy Trust;
 Balance of undistributed amount in PCD account has been deposited into Pasqua Legacy Trust Peace Hills Trust (PHT) Main Branch Edmonton, Alberta.

Future PCD payments will be made by PHT upon verification by PFN.





We have completed an new 1906 Surrender Historical report. This report has been presented to the Federal Government as part of our Claim to assist with getting our Claim validated. The new Legal Submission report was prepared by Maurice Law Group. Ensure that the Specific Claims office reviews our claim in a timely manner

1906 Surrender Claim:



PFN Submitted a settlement proposal to Minister Valcourt. PFN proposing \$130,00,000.00 as fair settlement. PFN is working with the Minister's office to obtain acceptance letter to negotiate and settle under Canada's Specific Claims Policy.

Housing:



Annual INAC budget: \$317,000.00 Amount has been the same since 1987 PFN required to build new homes and renovate existing ones. Current housing backlog is at 55 applications received this year. CMHC allocated 3 new houses to PFN for 2014. ♦ PFN built 27 new homes in last 3 years.

Housing:



New housing is determined by recommendations from Housing Committee to Chief & Council.

Current housing requires:
 Extensive renovations as per national building code.
 Flood repairs
 Mold remediation
 Overcrowding



Education: Post Secondary

Annual Budget: \$698,000.00 Funding is inadequate to address needs PFN contributes approximately \$200,000.00 from other revenue to address student applications. Funds PFN students to attend University or **Technical Institute** Applications for funding are received by PFN **Education Board**

 Board reviews applications pursuant to PFN Post Secondary Student Support Policy.



Education: Post Secondary

Sept 2013 to April 2014 Students
 Full Time: 46 students
 Includes Tuition, Books and Living Allowance
 Part Time: 10 students
 Includes either Tuition and/or books

Education: Secondary



Chief Paskwa Education Centre (CPEC)
 122 students enrolled in 2013 – 2014 school year
 Employs 8 teachers and 2 Behavioral/High Cost
 Specialized Teachers
 Employs 9 Education Assistants
