We are doing fairly well in our class.

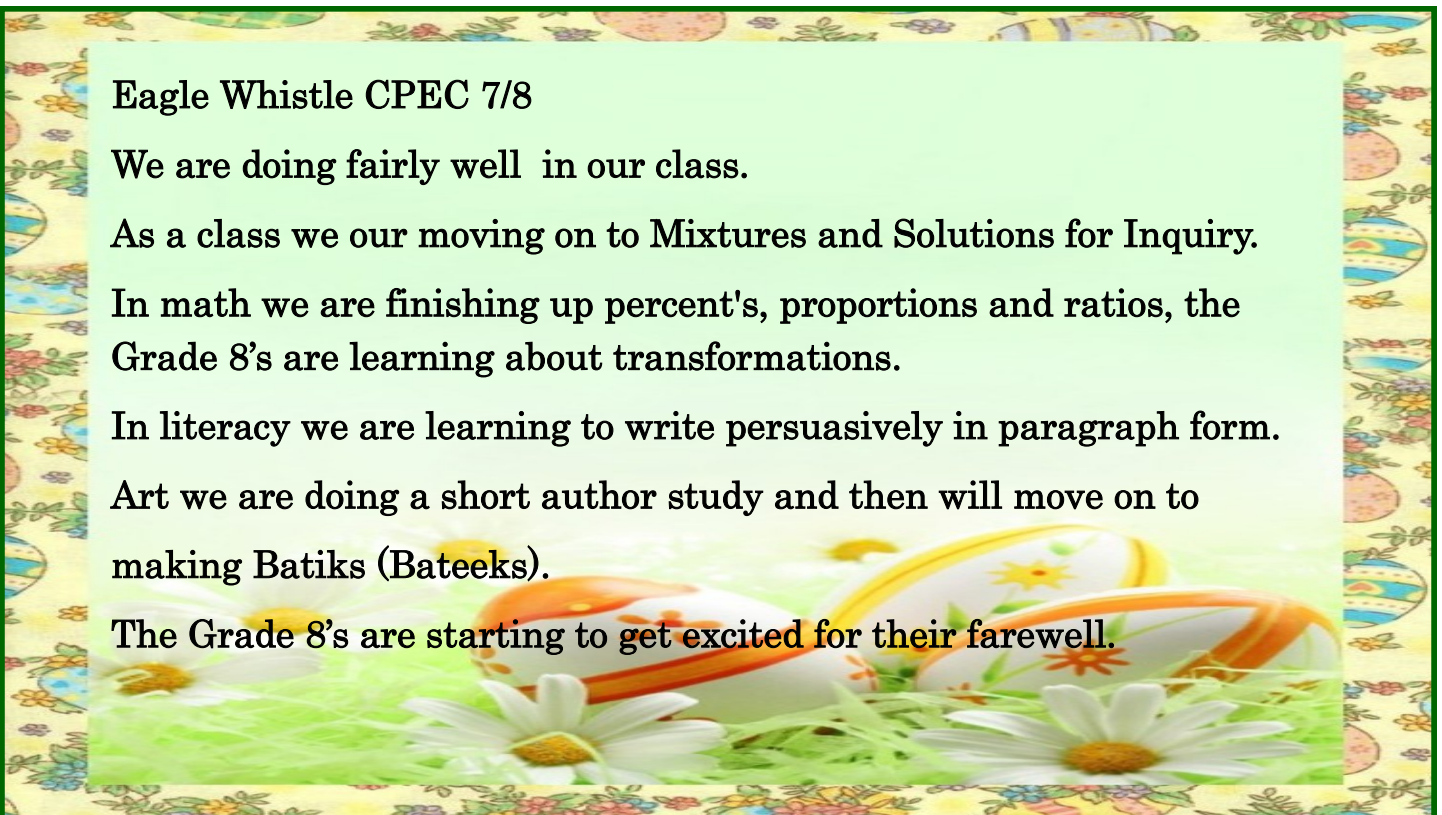
As a class we are moving on to Mixtures and Solutions for Inquiry.
