



COVID-19 UPDATE

Bulletin to First Nations in Saskatchewan

As with any other communicable disease in First Nations communities in Saskatchewan, public health follow-up and management of COVID-19 cases and contacts is coordinated by Indigenous Services Canada for south and central First Nations communities and by the Northern Inter-tribal Health Authority for the north First Nations communities.

Status Update

As of April 16, Saskatchewan has officially reported **305 cases of COVID-19**.

As of April 16, **21,569** COVID-19 tests have been performed in Saskatchewan.
